For example, students in the Faculty of Public Administration and Social Studies, both bachelor and master degree programs are taught and trained to become practitioners and leaders in public administration and public policy with morality and ethics according to professional principles. The faculty follows the university's educational philosophy; the 4Is model: International, Innovation, Integrity, and Industry as one of the concepts of teaching and learning:

International: The faculty uses case studies, research, articles, texts, and academic work from abroad as learning supplements. Foreign lecturers are invited as guest speakers or commentators to participate in extracurricular activities.

Innovation: modern online platforms, applications, discussion forums, etc., are adopted as teaching and learning methodologies to assist as instructional aids, communication channels, group project working, idea sharing, and feedback sharing.

Integrity: the faculty establishes and encourages students to follow rules and disciplines adhere to professional ethics such as rules for entering the classroom, exams, submitting assignments, conducting research, working in groups, acting as a good citizen, etc.

Industry: the faculty has official and unofficial academic cooperations with more than eight public and private agencies. Professional experts in specific fields are invited to teach or participate in the faculty's activities.

Students are taught and trained to become practitioners and leaders in public administration and public policy with morality and ethics according to professional principles.

The following are activities to provide students with hands-on experience on public administration and public policy.
